STATEMENT OF COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT ADOPTION STATEMENT

In accordance with Regulation 24(4) and Regulation 36 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Development) (England) Regulations 2004, notice is given that Horsham District Council will formally adopt its Statement of Community Involvement (SCI) on 17 February 2006.

The SCI is a formal statement of the District Council's policy for involving interested parties in preparing the Local Development Documents to be included in the Horsham District Local Development Framework (LDF) and for consulting on planning applications. The preparation of documents in the LDF and consultation on planning applications will have to comply with the adopted SCI.

An independent Inspector was appointed by the Government to examine the 'soundness' of the submitted SCI. The Inspector reported back to the District Council on 24 January 2006 setting out binding changes to be made to the submitted SCI. The Inspector's report is available for inspection at Planning Reception, Park North, North Street, Horsham, West Sussex RH12 1RL (Monday to Thursday 8.45am - 5.20pm, and Friday 8.45am - 4.20pm) and on Horsham District Council's website - www.horsham.gov.uk/strategic_planning.

Copies of the adopted SCI and adoption statement are available for inspection at Planning Reception, Park North, North Street, Horsham, on the Council's website, and at all libraries and Help Points in the District. Copies of the adopted SCI can be viewed on the website or obtained free of charge by contacting (01403) 215398.

Any person aggrieved by the SCI may make an application to the High Court under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004. Any challenge pursuant to Section 113 must be made on the grounds that the document is not within the appropriate power or a procedural requirement has not been complied with. An application under Section 113 must be made not later than the end of the period of six weeks starting from 17 February 2006.

Any person aggrieved by the SCI may apply to the High Court for permission to apply for Judicial Review of the decision to adopt the statement. Any such application must be made promptly and in any event not later than 3 months from 17 February 2006.
